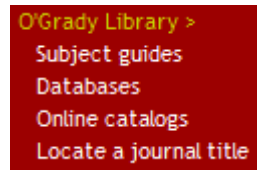
1. Find a Citation in your reading that interests you:


