



## How/When to Get Tested for COVID-19

### How do I get a test for COVID-19?

Saint Martin's Student Health Center has MULTIPLE testing options available for COVID-19 for students, staff and faculty:

- Rapid test (best if you have symptoms) with 15-minute results;
- PCR (LabCorp) with results in 2 – 3 days;
- SalivaDirect protocols, currently primarily for athletes, but we will be testing non-athlete residents by floor for surveillance-type testing (not diagnostic).

Note: You will need to have a current chart with us. If you are a student and have submitted immunization information to us, we have a chart for you. If you are a staff or faculty who has received a flu vaccine from us, we have a chart. If you're not sure, just ask!

Also, make sure we have your most current health insurance information. If you are with Kaiser, you will be directed to them for PCR tests, although we can still do rapid tests at the Health Center for you at no charge.

#### Scenario

**Feeling sick or have any new symptoms different from your usual state of health?** For instance, runny nose, headache, body aches, sore throat, diarrhea, etc.

**Been exposed to COVID-19?** For instance, have you been in contact with someone who has symptoms of COVID-19, has been tested for COVID-19, or has been diagnosed with COVID-19?

**Need a test for work or travel?**

#### What to do

STAY HOME and EMAIL (anytime) or CALL (during business hours) the Health Center to request a test.

Health Center will come to you in your residence hall if you are on campus or you can request a car-side swab.

We will likely offer both the rapid and the confirmatory PCR test.

EMAIL (anytime) or CALL (during business hours) the Health Center to request a test.

Health Center can administer the PCR test for this.

Note: Check specific testing guidelines for where you are traveling to as some states or countries change guidelines frequently.
